CHILDREN ARE WELCOME IN WORSHIP

Children bring richness to the community gathered at worship. They bring new ways of seeing familiar rituals and often show an understanding of the mystery of the sacraments lost to many adults. Children also bring movement, questions, and wonder. Their presence is essential to the vitality of the church. Here are some tried and true tidbits for parents and children:

- COME EARLY to get a good seat, preferably in front where children can see the action. Children (and adults!) are more likely to fidget if they can't see what's going on.
- SHARE your service bulletin or prayer book with young readers, and help them follow along. Even the youngest like to 'hold the book' like their parents.
- WE UNDERSTAND THAT KIDS are gifted noise-makers without a single thing in their hands! We welcome the sounds of children in worship.
- IF YOUR CHILD IS HAVING A MELTDOWN, feel free to take a break from worship. There is a rocking chair in the lobby!
- COLORING PAGES reflecting themes of the day are available in the display in the hallway.
- A CHANGING STATION in the Accessible Restroom located across from the small kitchen, by the Memorial Room. Please, ask an Usher if you need assistance.

SPECIAL ASSISTANCE

People have a variety of special needs, and St. David's hopes to be sensitive and responsive to them. To that end, we provide the following information:

- COMMUNION can be brought to you in your seat, should you have mobility issues. Please let the clergy or an usher know of your need.
- THOSE WITH ALLERGIES: The bread contains gluten and the wine contains alcohol. You may receive the Sacrament by receiving both, either, or neither and still receive the full spiritual benefit.
- HEARING ASSISTANCE DEVICES are available at the Ushers' stand at the rear of the worship space.
- GLUTEN-FREE WAFERS AVAILABLE Gluten-Free Communion wafers are now available. Just let Fr. Pete know at the time.

THE SEASON OF EASTER: THE GREAT FIFTY DAYS

The feast of Easter is a season of fifty days, from Easter Eve through the Day of Pentecost. From early times the Greek word pentecost (fiftieth day) was used also for the whole Paschal season. During this season there is no fasting. (Hooray!) The Council of Nicaea directed that Christians are to pray standing.

The word "alleluia" (praise the Lord) is said or sung repeatedly, which contrasts sharply with the season of Lent when the alleluia is omitted. The color of liturgical vestments and hangings is white or gold. The BCP notes that it is customary for the Paschal candle to burn at all services of the Easter season, as well as during funerals. The "Alleluia, alleluia" may be added to the dismissals and their responses during the Great Fifty Days. The traditional Christian Easter greeting (see Lk 24:34) serves as the opening acclamation at the eucharist during the Easter season.

Easter brings the return of...

THE PASCHAL CANDLE



The large candle symbolizing the risen Christ It is lighted on Easter Evening, to remain lighted throughout the fifty days of Eastertide.

Use of the word ALLELUIA




An exclamation derived from the Hebrew words meaning "Praise ye Jehovah." It is the word of highest praise in the Christian lexicon.

Use of INCENSE



A fragrant mixture of gums, resin, and spices, burned ceremonially in services of worship. It symbolizes sanctification, holiness, and our prayers rising up to God.

CHANTING the liturgy



The musical recitation of parts of the service such as the Sursum Corda.



THE FIRST LESSON Acts 10:44-48

One of the fledgling church's first struggles was to decide the scope of its ministry. Was God calling the early Christians to be a sect within Judaism, or was this to be an endeavor on a larger scale? The Holy Spirit settles the question.

hile Peter was still speaking, the Holy Spirit fell upon all who heard the word. The circumcised believers who had come with Peter were astounded that the gift of the Holy Spirit had been poured out even on the Gentiles, for they heard them speaking in tongues and extolling God. Then Peter said, "Can anyone withhold the water for baptizing these people who have received the Holy Spirit just as we have?"

So he ordered them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. Then they invited him to stay for several days.





THE SERMON

THE NICENE CREED

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.


THE GREAT THANKSGIVING

When the Holy Table has been prepared the Celebrant faces the People and sings or says...



It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth; but chiefly are we bound to praise you for the glorious resurrection of your Son Jesus Christ our Lord; for he is a the true Paschal Lamb, who was sacrificed for us, and has taken away the sin of the world. By his death he has destroyed death, and by this rising to life again he has won for us everlasting life.

Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who for ever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:



We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son.

For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore, according to his command, O Father,

We remember his death, We proclaim his resurrection, We await his coming in glory;

And we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, O Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine. We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts that they may be the Sacrament of the Body of Christ and his Blood of the new Covenant. Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we may be acceptable through him, being sanctified by the Holy Spirit.

In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us to that heavenly country where, with all of your saints, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation.




When you arrive at the altar, you may stand or kneel.






Saint David's Goes to the Ball Game!

MINISTRY TRANSITION

The Rector Search committee is honored to lead this process, in which there are two main phases:

PHASE 1

The first phase entails compiling what is referred to as a parish profile and will take several months. The search committee will need your input to create a robust and comprehensive parish profile. In the coming weeks and months you will receive a survey asking for your thoughts and input on various components of this profile. The search committee will also hold small group meetings in order to gain your perspective.

After the parish profile is complete, the Rector position will be posted and advertised nationally and there will be a period of time while the committee collects and evaluates candidate resumes.

PHASE 2

The second phase involves interviewing candidates. After a comprehensive interview process the search committee's candidate recommendation will be presented to the Vestry of Saint David's.
